NR 17, July 29, 1965

ARRL continually receives requests for schedules of stations sending code practice on the air. Amateurs who are maintaining extended code practice schedules are asked to file information with the ARRL Communications Department, indicating frequency, days, speeds and times. In setting up such schedules care is suggested to avoid conflict with net frequencies and times. For your convenience ask for Form CD 62 in filing information. NR18, August 5, 1965

All amateurs are invited to participate in the ARRL September Frequency Measuring Test, September 9th. Signals for measurement will be sent simultaneously from W1AW 0130 GMT September 9th on approximately 3505, 7060 and 14,047 kc., and at 0430 GMT on approximately 3512, 7020 and 14,065 kc. Complete details will appear in September QST. With increasing needs to observe and rectify signal deficiencies to promote clean operation on amateur bands, SCM's invite experienced amateurs to apply for Official Observer positions.

NR 19, August 12, 1965

A reciprocal operating agreement is now in effect between the United States and Luxembourg. Amateurs of one country visiting or residing in the other may obtain permission to operate their own amateur stations there. The United States has previously reached such agreements with Australia, Belgium, Bolivia, Canada, Costa Rica, the Dominican Republic, Ecuador and Portugal. The proposed license was to have been for channelized operation in the 29-Mc. band with no examination required and 10 watts permitted.

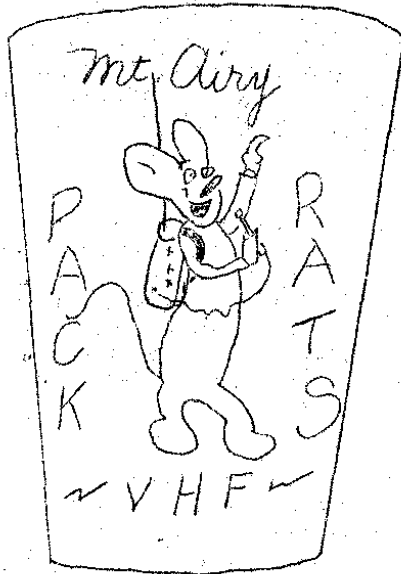

AMATEUR LICENSES FOR U.S. CITIZENS IN CANAL ZONE

The Commission approved the issuance of General Class amateur operator licenses to those United States citizens residing in the Canal Zone who have obtained comparable amateur operator licenses from Canal Zone authorities and advised Robert J. Fleming, Jr., Governor of the Canal Zone, who had requested this action, of the application procedures to be followed.

At the request of the Danish Government, call signs of U.S. Amateurs in Greenland are being changed and the prefix KG1 will no longer be used. Individual U.S. amateurs will have calls in the block QX4AA through QX5ZZ and may not handle third party traffic. Two special MARS stations will have amateur band calls XPIAA and XPIAB and are the only ones permitted to handle third party communications. This information will appear in the October issue of QST.
