NEW PRODUCTS OF INTEREST TO HAMS By Lyn, W3NSI

- 1. 1296 MHZ LINEAR SSB TRANSVERTER: The new MMT 1296-144 is designed to operate on 1296 using a 144-146 rig such as the Kenwood TS 700 as the IF unit. Output on 1296 is rated at 1.3W. and receiver noise figure is 2.5 db. Unit is composed of two cast aluminum boxes, one on top of the other for a total size of 7 1/2" x 5" x 4 1/2". One box contains the receive converter, other contains the LO, transmitter up converter, and amplifier. PIN diode S/R is used controlled by internal VOX or external over-ride. Price \$415.95. - 2. <u>DIP METER</u>: The new Kenwood DM-81 is now stocked in Ham outlets. The frequency range is 700 Khz to 250 Mhz in seven ranges using plug in coils. These coils plus capacitive probe and earphone can be carried inside the unit. It can also be used as a crystal checker for FT 243 or HC 25 type crystals. Price \$100.
- 3. VARIABLE CURRENT CIRCUIT BREAKER: The model 101 Breaker box is designed to be used on low voltage DC circuits to protect equipment during tests etc. Five switches on the panel can be used to set the trip current at 250 Ma to 7.75 amps in 1/4 amp increments. VHF/UHF REPORT By Joe. W2EIF

The VHF/UHF bands seem to be in the normally low activity period that usually sets in with the colder weather. The Tropo conditions for long haul contacts have just about shut down up '1 next Spring. There are still good contacts to be made out to 350 miles or so. One can usually find W8HEG Bob on the low end of 2 meters almost nitely. I suspect the long haul thrill of working VHF/UHF stations is limited to a few who can put up big antennas and run high power.

The six meter band is producing some good results on F2. As expected, the band started opening to Europe about the middle of October. There were the usual crossband 10 to 6 openings in the AM plus direct contacts with the EI6 boys and EL2AV in Liberia. These contacts were spotty and were taken advantage of by WA3AXV and N3AHI to earn their WAC certificates on 6 meters.

The early part of November began to produce good afternoon openings into the West Coast. The signals as they did last year would work up the coast and Alaska stations started to appear about November 6. That date yielded an opening from the West Coast to Japan. Alaska was in on November 8 as far West as Kodiak Island. November 8 to November 13 yielded good West Coast opening and November 13 was peculiar in that only Alaska stations (4 heard here) were coming thru. On November 14 the band again opened to NW and on November 15 there was a reported contact with a ZL2 by WA2VUN and El9D was worked by W3KKN. November 16 yielded El9D for W2EIF. No observations from here on the 18 and 19. The 20th produced an opening to Calif., Oregon and Washington and VE7 land. The West Coast stations were excited about LU-3's and 7's, being heard and called. No backscatter could be detected here. The activity is about as predicted. The F2 opening period will apparently be shorter than last year and should conclude in the next week or so. So you people that missed out will have to wait another 11 years!!!



EXTERNAL KEYING CIRCUIT FOR ICOM-IC-551 by Steven M. Simons. WA3WAS

is modification to the ICOM-IC-551 will provide a high current keying circuit for external amplifiers. The circuit provides a ground when the rig is in the transmit mode. The assembly can be glued in place on the bottom of the rig with a dab of RTV silicone seal.

The connections for power, ground and keying voltage are taken from the accessory socket on the back of the rig. The relay output is connected to the spare jack on the upper right hand corner of the rig. The parts list is as follows:



- 2 1000V lA Silicone Diode D1,D2 1 - 12V Minature Relay RL1
- 1 .001uf Disc Capacitor C1

- 3 Pins(gold plated) to fit in the accessory socket




Note: D1, D2, C1, C2 are used to prevent spikes. They protect the rig and external amplifiers; don't omit them.

LUBRICATION FOR CRANK-UP TOWERS by Steve, WA3WAS

After an extended period of time, the working mechanisms of your tower tend to become corroded. I have found that a liberal coaying of a good grade of motorcycle chain lube protects and lubricates the winch, pulleys and cables. This lubricant seems to resist extreme weather conditions. When the tower is down, spray all moving surfaces. When you are cranking up the tower, spray the cable as it is wound onto the winch.

A NOTE OF INTEREST by Jack Power, W2AXU

Reference: Sky and Telescope - Nov. 1980

Beginning in January 1981, the international Wolf sunspot numbers will no longer be provided by Zurich Observatory as I have reported to Cheese-Bits in the past. The numbers will be derived by A. Koeckelenbergh of the Sunspot Index Data Center in Brussels, Belgium.

The Sunspot Index Data Center will provide the monthly provisional sunspot numbers, predictions of monthly smoothed sunspot numbers and the annual international definitive Wolf numbers.

Observations from Zurichs' solar station and possibly Zurich itself, will remain the basis for the Sunspot Index Data Centers' number in order to maintain continuity.

(Zurich Smoothed Number for February 1980 is 163. Monthly Number for October 1980 is 162.9)

ARRL BULLETIN NR 116 FROM ARRL HEADQUARTERS NEWINGTON CT NOVEMBER 11, 1980 TO ALL RADIO AMATEURS BT

Freedom for amateurs to experiment with digital modes on all bands above 50 MHz has been requested by the American Radio Relay League, Inc. The petition was made public November 10, 1980 by the Federal Communications Commission which assigned the file number RM 3788 to the paper. FCC rules provide an automatic period of 30 days during which any interested party has the right to comment; the rules call for a copy of such comments to be sent to the petitioner, ARRL, Newington, CT 06111. Copies of RM 3788 may be obtained from ARRL; a return envelope is requested AR
